Here are two sample scripts, but you should speak from the heart:

"Hi, I'm Jane. I attend Whitney Young, but live in the Englewood neighborhood, so it takes me an hour and a half to get to school in the morning on the CTA. Being in an After School Matters program is so important to me because it gives me a safe place to hang out after school and make new friends. I learned a lot about myself this summer."
